

# I DON'T HAVE ENOUGH FAITH TO BE AN ATHEIST

## There was a Beginning

**Genesis 1; Psalm 19:1-4; Romans 1:18-20**  
**Week 3 of 8**

It was 1916 and Albert Einstein didn't like where his calculations were leading him. If his theory of General Relativity was true, it meant that the universe was not eternal but had a beginning. Einstein's calculations indeed were revealing a definite beginning to all time, all matter, and all space. This flew in the face of his belief that the universe was static and eternal (and, therefore, without the need of a beginning or a Creator). He later called his discovery "irritating" and introduced a "fudge factor" into his equations in order to show that the universe is static and to avoid the necessity of an absolute beginning. 9Norman L. In 1929 Einstein made a pilgrimage to Mount Wilson to look through Hubble's telescope for himself. What he saw was irrefutable. The *observational* evidence showed that the universe was indeed expanding as General Relativity had predicted. With his cosmological constant now completely crushed by the weight of the evidence against it, Einstein could no longer support his wish for an eternal universe. He subsequently described the cosmological constant as "the greatest blunder of my life," and he redirected his efforts to find the box top to the puzzle of life. Einstein said that he wanted "to know how God created the world. I am not interested in this or that phenomenon, in the spectrum of this or that element. I want to know His thought, the rest are details." [Fred Heeren, *Show Me God* (Wheeling, Ill.: Daystar, 2000), 135]
